Scene on The Magnificent Mile®! “God Bless America”

One's commute to work early morning to Michigan Avenue doesn't change too often; but if the commute includes Pioneer Court, keeping one's head up during the wee hours of the morning can present a pleasant surprise. For those who recognize “God Bless America” from Grant Wood's “American Gothic”, and even those who do not, will find themselves enjoying some eye candy during their morning tread. The surprise inevitably pops a question into the passerby's head, “Where did that sculpture come from?”

Currently, Pioneer Court boasts “God Bless America,” a Monumental Sculpture by an American Realist artist named J. Seward Johnson. The artist has created many beautiful thought provoking sculptures that live in public places all around the world. From Rockefeller Center in New York, to Pacific Place in Hong Kong, to West Lafayette, Indiana, these lifelike pieces capture the attention of the viewer. Over the past decade, Johnson has focused on three dimensional recreations of famous impressionist pieces with a touch of humor; one piece entitled “An Oriental Fan” is modeled after Monet's famous “La Japonaise” in which Monet's first wife poses in a lavish red kimono with a decorated fan. The painting, as a one dimensional piece, shows only the right side of the woman, looking backward. Upon walking around the sculpture Johnson modeled after the painting, one can see Monet's wife slipping her legs out from under her dress, thus intentionally leading to personal interpretation. In “God Bless America”, the artist has included shoes and a suitcase carrying various international stickers, on a piece that is usually interpreted as quite the opposite, stimulating conversation.

“King Lear” and “God Bless America” were both brought to North Michigan Avenue by The Sculpture Foundation as they have exclusive rights to Johnson's work, along with Zeller Realty Group. LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Executive Officers

Dear GNMAA Member:

As this is my last Chairman's Letter, I would like to thank the many GNMAA volunteers who helped make my term as your chairman a tremendous experience. When I look back over the past two years I am amazed at what our team has achieved and how GNMAA has grown!

Responding to the expressed needs of our members, we reinvented the first-quarter marketing campaign into TOAST on The Magnificent Mile®, instituted the innovative kinetic art exhibit to enhance Tulip Days on The Magnificent Mile®, and recruited the Chicago fashion design community as partners for Gardens of The Magnificent Mile®. Also, we established Empower PR and Davis Harrison Dion as GNMAA's first public relations and advertising agencies of record. We moved The Magnificent Mile Lights Festival Presented by Harris® production and broadcast to ABC7-Chicago, further strengthening its status as Chicago's largest single day event and a premier nationally televised broadcast.

Demonstrating a serious commitment to growth, we increased the number of members from 680 to 810 during the period, an all time high. Additionally, we transitioned to a more efficient calendar-year dues billing system.


To further meet member needs, we established four new task forces: the Protocol for Use of the Public Way Task Force to aggressively reduce abuse of our sidewalks and streets, the Burnham Plan Task Force to manage GNMAA's role in the City-wide celebration of the Plan of Chicago Centennial, the Sign Ordinance Review Task Force to ensure that Michigan Avenue signage remains tasteful, yet state-of-the-art, and finally the Sustainable Gardens Task Force to craft a long term plan for funding the median planters. Also, we established the Institutions Council, the Emerging Leaders Council, and the Luxury Marketing Council, while reestablishing the Dining & Nightlife Council.

Gala ticket sales and sponsorships increased by 17% while expenses were held to an increase of only 13%. Additionally, the Quarterly Membership Luncheons featured nationally respected authorities like Ivanka Trump, David Yurman, and the CEOs of Macy's, Southwest Airlines, and American Girl.

On top of all this, we gave our office a makeover for a more contemporary look. We also made the important decisions to contract with a new accountant, auditor, and intellectual property attorney. Finally, while total GNMAA revenue grew by 26% to over \$2.5 million, expenses increased by only 16%.

In summary, it was a huge team effort that not only strengthened The Magnificent Mile® as One of the Great Avenues of the World®, but gave GNMAA new tools to advance our organization into the future.

I owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to each and every one of you who played a role and feel honored to have had the opportunity to serve as your chairman.

Burnham in the Spotlight

As we celebrate the centennial of the Plan of Chicago, we also celebrate Burnham, the man behind the plan. While the Plan of Chicago has become synonymous with Burnham, let us not forget that while Burnham was the genius behind the Plan, it would not have been successful if it were not for an able assistant, Edward H. Bennett or the people that promoted the Plan after Burnham’s death – Charles H. Wacker and Walter D. Moody. In addition to these other great men, there were people in other organizations like the Merchants Club, the Commercial Club, and the North Central Business District Association, the forerunner of our Greater North Michigan Avenue Association that fulfilled many of the Plan’s dreams.

Burnham, a native of upstate New York lived on the shores of Lake Erie and moved to Chicago early in life, attended high school in Chicago but did not attend college. Burnham was a good artist and athlete, but at age 22, he could not find a career to suit his talents. Taking the advice of a former tutor, he explored a career as an architect. In 1873, after apprenticing with two Chicago architectural firms, Burnham at age 22 formed a business partnership with John W. Root and the firm quickly grew during those post-Great Chicago Fire years.

However, Burnham became famous as the Director of Works for the 1893 World’s Columbian Exposition in Chicago. The Fair was an international success and with it, Burnham helped give birth to the “City Beautiful” movement that believed a city could be attractive places to live. Burnham spread the “City Beautiful” to other cities -- including Washington, D.C. (1902), Cleveland (1903), San Francisco (1904), and in 1905, two cities in the Philippines -- Manila and Baguio.

In the years following the great Fair, Burnham made several speeches to the Merchants Club and Commercial Club about how to make Chicago a more attractive place to live. His first talk to the Commercial Club was on December 1894 -- “What Should be Done with the Lake Front?”

He traveled to Europe several times, first in 1896 and again in 1901, 1907, and 1908 bringing back to Chicago more ideas about how to make our city beautiful. Burnham first directed his attention in 1896 to developing a Lake Front Plan. In January 1904, he again made a presentation to the Commercial Club, on the Plan of Chicago. However, it was not until 1906 that Burnham received funding from the members of the Commercial Club to move forward with drawing up a plan, which included connecting Michigan Avenue south of the River to Lake Shore Drive via Pine Street – today’s Michigan Avenue as a great boulevard.

The Plan of Chicago was finished and presented to the public on July 4, 1909. It took several years after the public presentation of the Plan before implementation started. Burnham, however, did not live to see his creation. That was left for Wacker and Moody among others. Burnham at age 66, at the peak of his career, ran the world’s largest architectural firm, died in Heidelberg, Germany during yet another European trip in 1912. His mortal remains are buried on the Island at Graceland Cemetery, but his spirit of making no small plans lives on with us today.

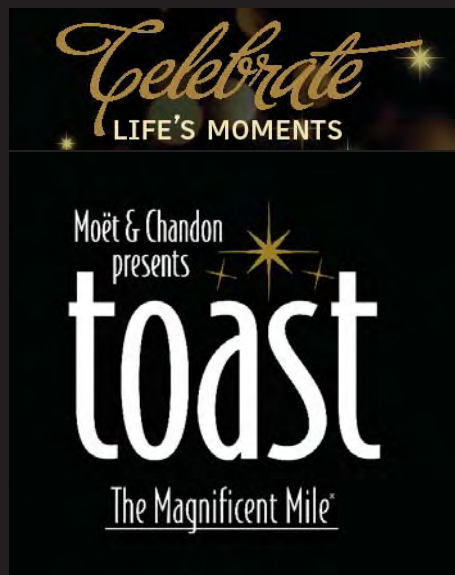

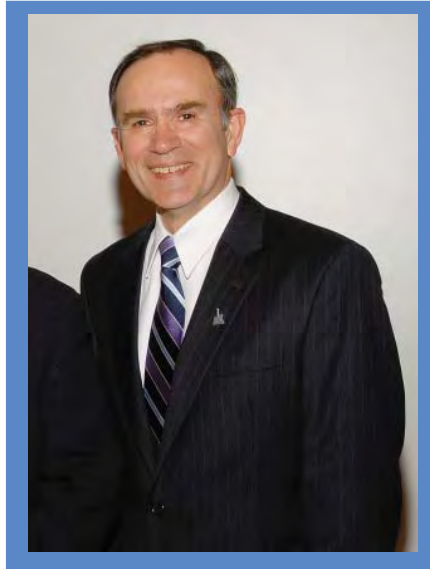
